Creative Cabinet Solutions of Westerville, OH and JS Brown& Company of Columbus, OH, joined together in designing this spectacular, award winning kitchen remodel. This unique house, set on a wooded lot, was purchased by the owners with the thought that they would remodel the small, outdated kitchen, as well as a few other areas of the home to suit their needs. Planning for the project began with JS Brown & Co. handling the remodeling duties, and Creative Cabinet Solutions designing and building the kitchen.

Because the small, contemporary style kitchen did not suit the clients needs or taste, it became evident that a room addition would be needed, and the kitchen redesigned and reconfigured to create a larger space. Custom cabinetry would complete the design and provide the comfortable atmosphere these clients wanted. Their entire wish list included: an area of storage for spices and cookbooks, rollout trays for pot and pan storage, built in space for a television, open display areas and an island.

The design presented incorporated all of these important requirements and more! The U-shape kitchen layout with traiditional framed cabinetry was exactly what these clients were looking for.

Additionally, solid wood dovetail drawer boxes with Blum full extension drawer glides allow for full access to the contents of the drawers. The custom built - full functional hood, extends to the ceiling and is a focal point of the kitchen. Enkeboll carved moldings and turned legs were added to complete a "furniture look" on the cabinetry.


The refigerator and freezer are comletely concealed behind door panels, and a double oven as well as warming drawer and pro-style gas cook top, speed up meal preparation. A wine cooler and second dishwasher in the island add a special touch to entertaining and clean up.

In the adjoining dining area, a hutch was added with the same door style as in the kitchen, along with a black painted rub through finish. The hutch showcases a new quartz surfacing countertop with a color that perfectly compliments the granite and ceramic tile tops in the kitchen.

To achieve all of this, the new kitchen design had to include an addition that would require part of the back decking of the home to be removed to make room for the new space. The new room would span out 12 feet and would rest on the existing brick piers. The piers were modified to provide ample support for the new kitchen. Special care was taken to match the existing brick and morter on the exterior of the home. The roof structure was redesigned to incorporate the proper transition from "old" to "new."

The kitchen is complete with a combination of natural light from the vast windows and skylights as well as recessed can lighting and pendant fixtures. The task lighting and accent lighting above the cabinets and in the pass through area are an additional touch that really
